As I write this, I am preparing to officiate at the celebration of life for three-year-old Josie. I am reminded of Ecclesiastes 3:1: "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven (ESV). These musings bring to mind a question: What is our season? In the life of our church, in what season do we find ourselves?

This question brings to mind another Scripture. Lamentations 3:19-20 tell us: "The thought of my suffering ... is bitter beyond words. I will never forget this awful time, as I grieve over my loss (NLT). Whether spiritual, social, or political, many in our church are experiencing loss. When we experience loss, it is easy to get angry. This is simply because anger is easier than immense depths of sadness. And we need to know, it's okay to be angry, but we need to work through that and actually deal with our sadness. We need to deal with our sense of loss.

I often find that we South Dakotans don't properly lament. We don't deal with our sadness. We "pull ourselves up by our own bootstraps." We "buck up" and we "put on a happy face." The meaning is clear: "Get over it—and get over it by yourself." In short, we do not properly lament. And because we do not properly lament, we remain mired in sadness, sadness which often becomes firmly entrenched anger.

So, what is the solution? After all, we need to lament. Whenever we experience loss, we experience grief. And whenever we experience grief, we need to lament. Remember Lamentations 3:19-20 and spend some time in lament. Just don't make that your permanent home. When Jeremiah wrote those verses, he didn't stop at verse 20. No, he continued on: "21Yet I still dare to hope when I remember this: 22The faithful love of the Lord never ends! His mercies never cease. 23Great is his faithfulness; his mercies begin afresh each morning. 24I say to myself, "The Lord is my inheritance; therefore, I will hope in him!"

What season are we in? We are in a season of hope. Hear that again: We are in a season of hope. We have hope—and that hope is Jesus Christ. And we not only have hope, we have purpose. Our purpose is to love God, to worship and praise God—and our purpose is to love our neighbor as ourselves. The Apostle Paul writes in Romans 13: "8Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. 9For the commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁰Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law" (8-10, ESV).

Love. Hope. If you have experienced loss, take time to lament but do not lose hope. If you find yourself angry or bitter, take time to lament but do not lose hope. If you have lost or severed relationships because of differing spiritual, social, or political beliefs, take time to lament but do not lose hope. Do not lose hope. Do not lose love. Love does no wrong to a neighbor for love is the fulfilling of the law.

Love. Hope. Join us in this season of hope. Join us in loving God and loving our neighbor. Join us in worshipping, praising and glorifying God. Join us.

Renuevo Special Evening

Seventy individuals from around South Eastern South Dakota gathered together on the evening of Friday, July 9th at the Plankinton United Methodist Church. They welcomed Saul & Elizabeth Sarmiento who reside in Texas but travel across the country to preach the Word of God. Pastor Herman Perez organized this special evening for the Plankinton Renuevo Ministry.



Evangelist Saul Sarmiento shared from Luke 5:1-11. The theme of his message was: Go into the deep and cast your nets; force yourself to go just a little bit more. In reading these verses you meet two important characters: 1) Jesus, our glorious Savior and 2) Peter, the leader of the first church. Jesus was teaching and there were so many people that he had to move into a boat so that he could better be heard. Jesus was having a great—prosperous—day. However Peter was not having a good day.

Saul asked the congregation to think about a job where you go and "Punch Out" to go home. You punch out frustrated that nothing has gone right, feeling like you accomplished absolutely nothing. You were expecting things to happen, you were there watching and waiting. Peter had an optimistic spirit and perhaps said "Not today, but tomorrow will be my day." There is a season and a time. God always shows up in his time. Watch the nets and wait and see what God is about to do.

In the story there were two boats. Jesus had gathered in the boat with Peter. Peter's boat had no fish; so, why did Jesus choose that boat. Jesus had an interest in that boat.

At the shore is where the ground meets the water. It is muddy and messy and things get dirty. This is where many of us want to give up. But remember, Jesus has an interest in this town, your life, this "boat".

Peter needed to hear what Jesus was calling him to do. Jesus asked Peter to move his boat out into the deep water, and let down the nets. You need to let go of your agenda and move towards God's agenda. That is when things will happen. Jesus has promised each of us that he will be with us all the days of our life. He tells us to go back to the place where we failed and cast our nets. Go back to where nothing worked but this time you are going because God is telling you to go. You are not walking in your own strength but in God's power and strength. When Peter cast the nets, as he was told, the nets broke with the weight of the overflowing abundance of fish. So breakthrough and submit yourself to the Word of God. Get on your knees and pray for God's forgiveness and blessings.

Following evangelist Saul's powerful message, he invited individuals to the altar for prayer; most in attendance accepted his invitation at the altar. It was awesome to see God at work in our community.

The evening concluded with a time of celebration and fellowship over a meal and lemonade/coffee.

The financial situation of the day to day operation of the church is critical.

The income for the first six months of 2021 is \$35,880.00 The expense for the first six months of 2021 is \$48,373.11

This is a negative amount - \$24,493.11

—This shows we are running approximately \$2,100.00 short each month of meeting our expenses.

—We have been able to stay above water until now because we applied for a Paycheck Protection Program loan in 2020 along with the Dakota Conference forgiving two months of our direct health and direct pension expenses. However, these funds are now depleted and as of June 30, 2021, our checking account balance stands at a negative \$115.38.

—To keep the church doors open, we prayerfully are asking all members of the church to think about increasing your tithe. Either through using the Tithe.ly app, ACH through your bank, sending in a check, or by attendance each Sunday. We thank you for your support!

PUMC 14 Board Meeting Highlights

- -The Plankinton United Methodist Church 14 (PUMC14) which was formerly named the Administrative Board meet monthly to review the work of the church and the activities of the church. They are also responsible for the policies of the church.
- -Over the past year, the members of the PUMC14 have worked together to keep the church members safe and comfortable within the church during the Pandemic with the policies being updated on a regular basis. Thank you for your leadership.
- -Currently they are in the process of working on the creation of worship, memorial, and missions committees; purchasing and compiling a new memorial book; and directing the continued goal of completing the parking lot. It has been quite a celebration to have completed 2/3 of the parking lot through the generous donations of each of you. Thank you!
- -Additionally through this past year, even in the midst of the Pandemic, the work has continued with Plankinton UMC providing a location and support for the creation of the Hispanic service, Renuevo Plankinton, which meets each Friday evening. Other items that have been accomplished this year under the guidance of the Board include the roof replacement after the hail damage, updates to policies, participating in the Commissioning Process for Pastor Rodney, and guiding the process to get back to regular worship services and other activities of the church.

-2021 Annual Conference Highlights

Theme: In a time of continual changes, God is calling United Methodists in the Dakotas to remain rooted in Christ. Drawing on our collective values of Jesus, Mission and Connection, the theme of this year's annual conference session is "**Jesus. Waymaker.**" We explored ways in which we need to step out of our comfort zone and follow the path to live like Jesus in ways beyond our imagination.

Bishop's Episcopal Address: "Where is Christ's compassion? Didn't Jesus call that woman (begging for help) a dog? A woman whose young daughter is possessed by an unclean spirit finds out about Jesus and falls at his feet," Bishop Laurie Haller stated in her first sermon, the 2021 Episcopal Address, to the Dakotas Conference of The United Methodist Church. Bishop Laurie invited all those listening to transform their hearts and minds, continuing to share the good news of Jesus, the Waymaker. "Keep on innovating. Keep on sharing the good news. And keep on discerning in humility and wisdom how God invites each of us to transform hearts and minds. Wait a minute. Didn't Jesus just call you "beloved child of God?"

Legislation: Delegates affirmed all legislation put before them during the twenty-eighth session of the Dakotas Annual Conference including: the ratification of a disaffiliation agreement allowing Prairie Winds Church in Dickinson, North Dakota, to leave The United Methodist Church; affirmation of a resolution advocating for the inclusion of all people in the life of the church; and voting yes to a resolution calling for boards and related agencies of the Dakotas Conference to begin planning for a separation of the denomination.

In other matters before the body, a 2022 budget was approved with a slight decrease in spending, four clergy were commissioned as elders, three were ordained as elders, the retirement of five clergy was celebrated, and the slate of nominations for all committees, boards and agencies was approved.

Miracle Offering: Our 2021 Miracle Offering, Feeding the Dakotas is an effort to help feed 150,000 people who face hunger daily in the Dakotas. So far, we've collected close to \$40,000. We are over half -way to the finish line. Help us reach our goal of \$75,000 to be shared with the Great Plains Food Bank in North Dakota, Feeding South Dakota, and grants to local hunger ministries.
